



Training Programme: From Ambassador to Student Teacher

ATTENTION Youth!

Rhodes University's Centre for Social Development (CSD) in collaboration with SIOC Community Development Trust (SIOC-CDT) and the Northern Cape Department of Education is offering an opportunity, for unemployed youth, that creates a career pathway for those who have an interest in teaching. Successful candidates will be placed in different no-fee public primary schools around the SIOC-CDT beneficiary communities in John Taolo Gaetsewe (JTG) District. They will work with Foundation Phase teachers as Literacy Ambassadors for a period of one year, during which they will receive a stipend. In the same period, successful candidates will have an opportunity to upgrade their NSC results to enable them, upon completion of this training programme, to apply for enrolment into the Bachelor of Education - Foundation Phase with recognised institutions of higher learning.

Literacy Ambassadors will receive thorough ongoing training on how children learn to read so that they are equipped with various skills they need to work with the Foundation Phase teachers to help improve literacy levels of learners.

- Reside in or originate from the JTG in the Northern Cape
- Minimum of Diploma pass at NSC (Matric)
- Be fluent in Setswana and English
- Have facilitation and presentation skills
- Have good verbal and writing skills and be able to read for meaning in Setswana
- Be a self-initiator, who is pro-active, resourceful and creative
